

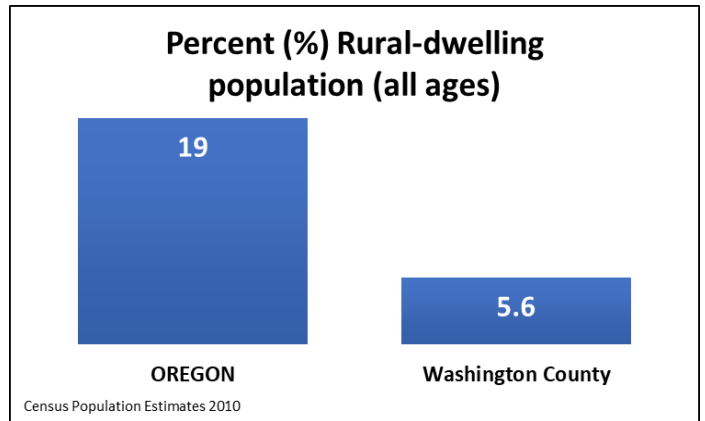
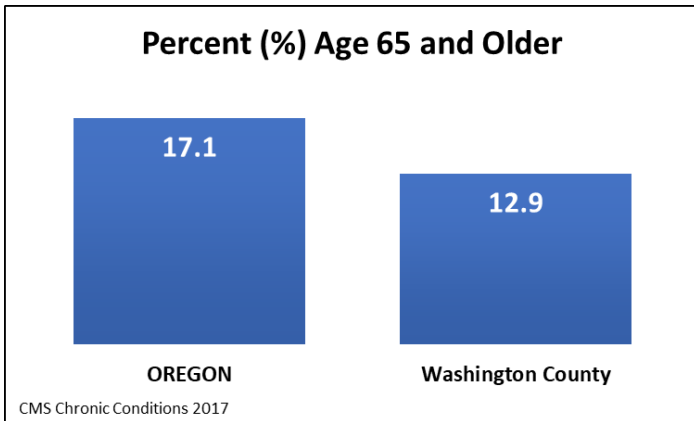
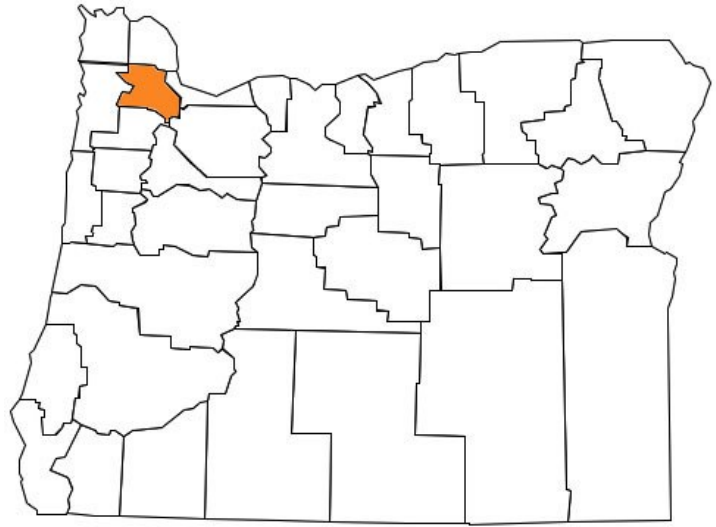
Washington County Profile

Overview

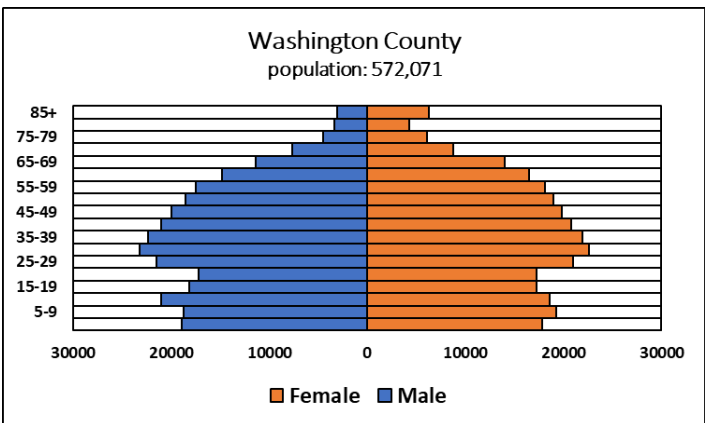
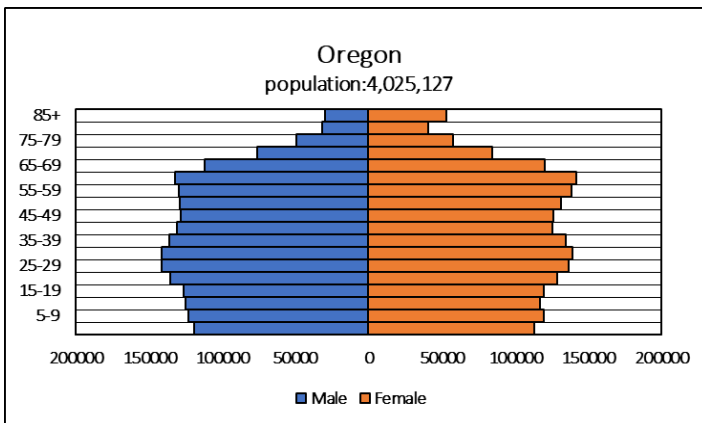
Washington County spans approximately 726 square miles, making it the sixth smallest county by area in Oregon.
